STUDY, AGRI, RENO

The peace initiative “KURVE Wustrow – Centre for Training and Networking in non-violent Action” was founded 30 years ago in Wendland. The initiative is rooted in non-violent resistance against the nuclear plant in Gorleben, which is situated close by. The overall aim of the Centre is to develop non-violent action alternatives in conflicts and to resolve social problems, as well as to reinforce non-violence as an active principle. They offer seminars on non-violent conflict resolution and non-violent actions for German and international volunteers. They have partner organisations in Palestine and on the Balkans, with whom they exchange experiences and share knowledge and they send volunteers and peaceworkers to their partner organizations. W: Renovating the front of a half-timbered house, various work in repairing and cleaning in the house and in the garden S: Peace is not the absence of war. What does non-violence and non-violent action mean? A: Cosy guest house with showers and dormitories Q: Strong interest on working on non-violence. Tonndorf Castle is situated in the Weimar county – the so called „Toscany of the East“. The property with 40 acres consists of the castle (a former fortress), its tower, a well and a trench, some other buildings for living and working as well as of woods, orchards, meadows and vegetable gardens. 34 adults and 30 children between 0 and late 50s belong to the community. Together they bring this special place back to life, build apartments and workspaces, plant and harvest, organize festivals, markets, lectures, concerts, seminars and workcamps with all in all about 5.000 visitors each year. W: It is estimated to build - together with the community members - shelters for bicycles (working project can be changed) as well as for fire wood (the whole castle is heated by wood – to have it properly dry is very essential); you are also welcome to participate in garden work and in the community kitchen S: The experience of living in a community; understanding of collective planning, decision-making and management as well as the beauty and the troubles of communal life; inspiration in the following fields possible: alternative learning and teaching, self-subsistence, supporting an agriculture free of genetic manipulation, ecological building techniques (including strawbale-building); excursions to Weimar (Goethe, Bauhaus etc.) and Erfurt A: In tents and guestrooms; organic meals together with the community; shared bathrooms; compost toilets Q: Enjoying collective work outdoors X: A warm atmosphere in a very special place.

At the age of climate change and global injustice the question appears, if we have to change our consume-oriented and resource wasting lifestyle. A person who practices a consequently natural life is Friedmunt Sonnemann. He owns 4 hectares of land, situated in a forest near the small wine and tourist town of Bernkastel-Kues. He cultivates plants, which are threatened or endangered, and sells the seeds to various garden plot holders. The hut where he resides has neither a water pipe nor electricity, and the road to it is not paved. Life in this remote area, one hour up the hill, is not suitable for everyone, therefore the volunteers must be able to adapt to simple living conditions, live an organic lifestyle and are willing to avoid waste. Living room, spring water and telephone are available.

W: Depending on the weather conditions, working in the fields, building a constructed wetland for waste water treatment or construction of the house with simple materials (loam and straw); working also on Saturday morning S: Botany, discussion about the extinction of rare crops A: In the barn, kitchen available, compost toilet Q: Adapting to basic conditions and endure this life style for two weeks.

Work: In the forest an international youth centre called "Forstcamp Bogensee" will be created. The buildings were built in the thirties and were used in the former GDR too. The idea of this place is to make people appreciate nature, woodland and the environment. The focus of interest will be practical experience in ecological education. At the "Waldschule" (forest school) and in seminars young people work and study in the forest, in the project garden and in the yard. The idea of the camp is to support this project. The volunteers will collect firewood in the forest, remove non-native plants, care for the herb and project garden, participate in the biotope and species protection programme as well as support the renovation work at the house. Location: on the island without electricity Terminal: Berlin Accommodation: Big tents Special remarks: The island

is very isolated and you have to be a real nature lover to participate in this project. You have to use the ferry every day and it stops running about 8 p.m.. There is no chance to visit Berlin during the week.

AGRI, ENVI, STUDY

This ecology work camp is organised in co-operation with a regional office for nature and landscape protection in Tuebingen and a regional organisation for the preservation of the cultural heritage. Two hills of a former wine growing area near the famous old university town in Tuebingen, are well known as a habitat for rare and endangered species and have been declared nature reserves. These areas have to be maintained regularly, so that bushes and trees do not override vegetation that must be sheltered. As an active university town, Tuebingen has a lively student population, which is displayed by its numerous pubs and active nightlife. It is also a town of historical significance, with many famous framework buildings and the opportunity to punt on the river Neckar (a special for Tuebingen). In addition, Tuebingen is situated in a beautiful area of Baden-Wuerttemberg and continues to maintain a great cultural history.

W: Working with experts, woods and fields have to be cut and cleared and dead wood has to be removed from the protected area. S: Ecological problems, biotope and nature protection, geology, Study tour with the eco-mobile to explore flora, fauna and habitat, history of Tuebingen. A: In a municipal building on camp-beds Q: Interest in ecological themes, being prepared for physical work. X: You will work in a slope position, therefore you have to be properly equipped for it. Hardy working shoes with jags in the soles will be necessary.
